### Main Ideas

- ❖ Different views and perspectives exist with respect to reconciling nationalist and non-nationalist loyalties including: First Nations – Métis – Inuit – Quebecois
- ❖ Contending/competing loyalties can affect the choices people make
- ❖ Cultural pluralism has both advantages and disadvantages
- ❖ Contending/competing nationalist and non-nationalist loyalties may create conflict
- ❖ Some people have attempted to reconcile conflicting nationalist loyalties (Exemplar Gratia: Aboriginal Peoples)
- ❖ Aboriginal land claims are the greatest source of conflict between aboriginals and government
