Main Ideas

- ❖ Individuals and groups have different ideas about what is in a nation’s best interests
- ❖ National interest can influence foreign policies (Expansionism, Appeasement, and Isolationism for example)
- ❖ The Treaty had a major effect on the people of Europe after WW I
- ❖ Propaganda is an effective tool for ultrationalists
- ❖ There are many ways to respond to ultrationalism (appeasement, peacekeeping, war)
- ❖ Ultrationalism has resulted in crimes against humanity (Rwanda, Nazi Germany)
- ❖ There are often negative unintended consequences when nationalities seek sovereignty and/or self- determination
